

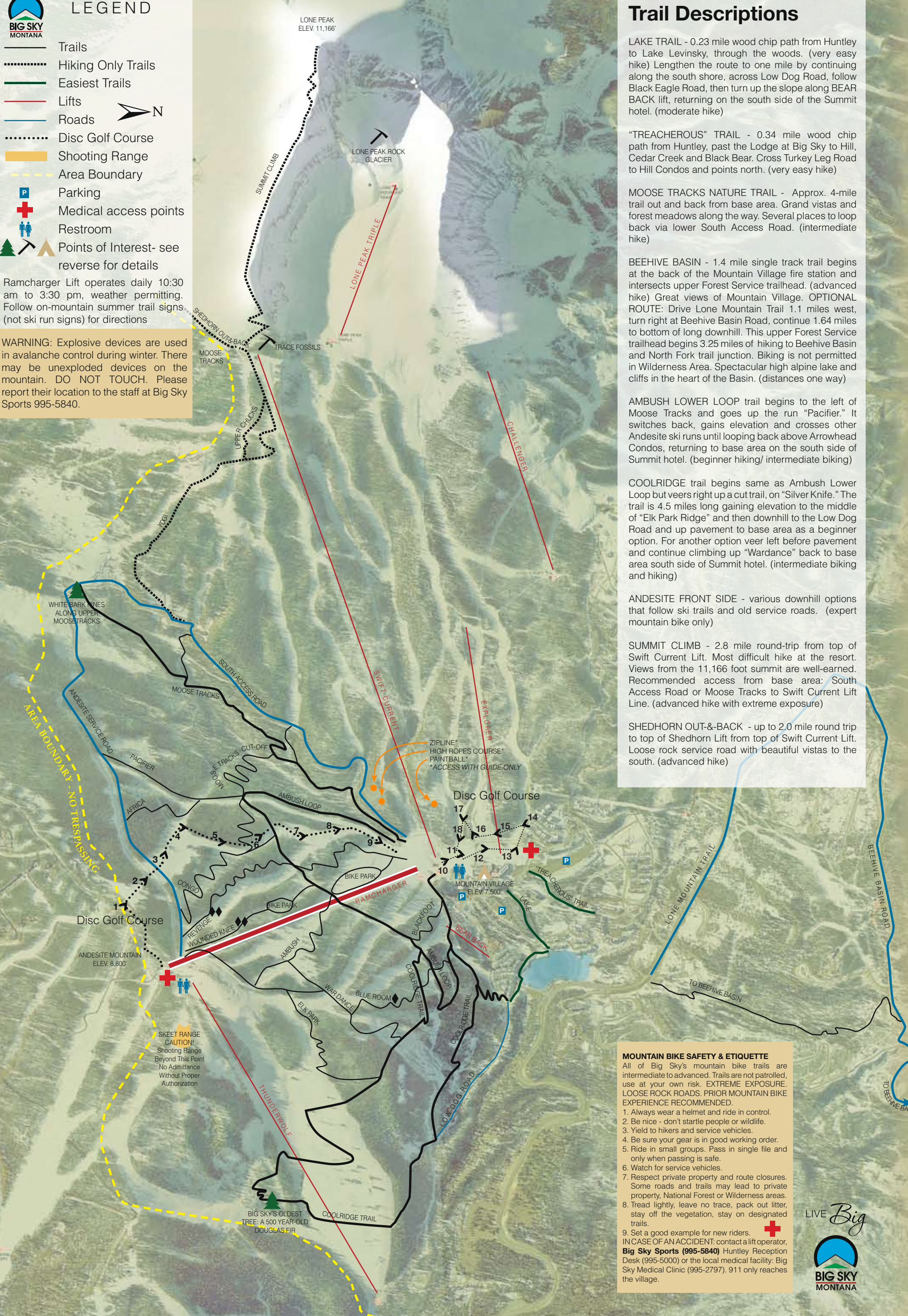

Ramcharger Lift operates daily 10:30 am to 3:30 pm, weather permitting. Follow on-mountain summer trail signs (not ski run signs) for directions

Trail Descriptions

LAKE TRAIL - 0.23 mile wood chip path from Huntley to Lake Levinsky, through the woods. (very easy hike) Lengthen the route to one mile by continuing along the south shore, across Low Dog Road, follow Black Eagle Road, then turn up the slope along BEAR BACK lift, returning on the south side of the Summit hotel. (moderate hike)

"TREACHEROUS" TRAIL - 0.34 mile wood chip path from Huntley, past the Lodge at Big Sky to Hill, Cedar Creek and Black Bear. Cross Turkey Leg Road to Hill Condos and points north. (very easy hike)

MOOSE TRACKS NATURE TRAIL - Approx. 4-mile trail out and back from base area. Grand vistas and forest meadows along the way. Several places to loop back via lower South Access Road. (intermediate hike)

BEEHIVE BASIN - 1.4 mile single track trail begins at the back of the Mountain Village fire station and intersects upper Forest Service trailhead. (advanced hike) Great views of Mountain Village. **OPTIONAL ROUTE:** Drive Lone Mountain Trail 1.1 miles west, turn right at Beehive Basin Road, continue 1.64 miles to bottom of long downhill. This upper Forest Service trailhead begins 3.25 miles of hiking to Beehive Basin and North Fork trail junction. Biking is not permitted in Wilderness Area. Spectacular high alpine lake and cliffs in the heart of the Basin. (distances one way)

AMBUSH LOWER LOOP trail begins to the left of Moose Tracks and goes up the run "Pacifier." It switches back, gains elevation and crosses other Andesite ski runs until looping back above Arrowhead Condos, returning to base area on the south side of Summit hotel. (beginner hiking/ intermediate biking)

COOLRIDGE trail begins same as Ambush Lower Loop but veers right up a cut trail, on "Silver Knife." The trail is 4.5 miles long gaining elevation to the middle of "Elk Park Ridge" and then downhill to the Low Dog Road and up pavement to base area as a beginner option. For another option veer left before pavement and continue climbing up "Wardance" back to base area south side of Summit hotel. (intermediate biking and hiking)

ANDESITE FRONT SIDE - various downhill options that follow ski trails and old service roads. (expert mountain bike only)

SUMMIT CLIMB - 2.8 mile round-trip from top of Swift Current Lift. Most difficult hike at the resort. Views from the 11,166 foot summit are well-earned. Recommended access from base area: South Access Road or Moose Tracks to Swift Current Lift Line. (advanced hike with extreme exposure)

SHEDHORN OUT-&-BACK - up to 2.0 mile round trip to top of Shedhorn Lift from top of Swift Current Lift. Loose rock service road with beautiful vistas to the south. (advanced hike)

MOUNTAIN BIKE SAFETY & ETIQUETTE

All of Big Sky's mountain bike trails are intermediate to advanced. Trails are not patrolled, use at your own risk. **EXTREME EXPOSURE. LOOSE ROCK ROADS. PRIOR MOUNTAIN BIKE EXPERIENCE RECOMMENDED.**

1. Always wear a helmet and ride in control.
2. Be nice - don't startle people or wildlife.
3. Yield to hikers and service vehicles.
4. Be sure your gear is in good working order.
5. Ride in small groups. Pass in single file and only when passing is safe.
6. Watch for service vehicles.
7. Respect private property and route closures. Some roads and trails may lead to private property, National Forest or Wilderness areas.
8. Tread lightly, leave no trace, pack out litter, stay off the vegetation, stay on designated trails.
9. Set a good example for new riders.

IN CASE OF AN ACCIDENT: contact a lift operator, Big Sky Sports (995-5840) Huntley Reception Desk (995-5000) or the local medical facility: Big Sky Medical Clinic (995-2797). 911 only reaches the village.

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SCENIC LIFT

This is an experience for everyone to enjoy. Ride round-trip to a height of 8,800 feet on a ski lift to the summit of Andesite Mountain. The lift ride may not be suitable for those with mobility limitations or very small children. If you choose to hike or bike down, refer to the map on reverse. Please allow extra time for downloading. We recommend taking a sweater or jacket. Temperatures are cooler at higher elevations and the weather can change quickly. Comfortable shoes, sunglasses, camera, binoculars and sunscreen are also recommended. Watch your step on loose rocks. Picnic tables and restrooms are available at the top. Open daily from 10:30 am - 3:30 pm June 23 through October 2, 2010 (weather permitting). Last ride down at 3:45 pm.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Locations shown on reverse. Please respect our landmarks. Don't take samples. Don't leave a mark.

LONE PEAK ROCK GLACIER- Located in the bowl on the North side of Lone Peak. This ice and rock formation is currently being researched by Montana State University and the Big Sky Institute to find clues to past weather patterns.

TRACE FOSSILS- Trace fossils and ancient tracks left by a creature are found in the Great White area. These particular trace fossils appear to be from the zoophycus, a clam-like marine invertebrate, from the late Cretaceous Period. Petrified wood can also be found on the banks of the Gallatin near Porcupine Creek.

WHITEBARK PINES ALONG UPPER MOOSETRACKS- Whitebark pines are common in the area and are a favorite food of Grizzly Bears. Look for marks high up the trunks of the trees where bears have scratched lines in the bark.

BIG SKY'S OLDEST TREE- This Douglas Fir is estimated to be over 500 years old.

BIG SKY INSTITUTE TEACHING TIPI- You'll notice two attractive tents in the Base Area. These traditional Native American tents offer educational displays. Big Sky Resort has teamed up with a research division of nearby Montana State University to bring the Big Sky Institute to visitors.
